- **April 29, 2008**

Message from Paula:

Hi everybody...just an update. Don, Randy and myself met Tim Miller and his team down here in Panama City Monday evening. They are working to eliminate the areas that Pam is NOT in. They worked today with underwater sonar to search the area in the bay, especially around the bridge and Tim told us that they feel certain that she is not at all in the water. They are going to work with Bay County and volunteers tomorrow on some of the wooded areas that have only been lightly covered. After sitting down last night and talking to us and finding out more about Pam, they feel strongly that she has suffered a complete breakdown...just snapped and is lost or in a facility. We showed them the two different pictures...the one we started out using on the flyers and the one that we just had printed. Those pictures were both made in the month of April, one year ago. We had not even realized that. As you all can see, the difference is pretty dramatic. They also have people in Texas working a 500 mile radius check with shelters and facilities. It encourages us to keep up with our contacts and keep working until we find Pam. Tim has worked on a couple of other cases that had similar "mental" and/or "amnesia" circumstances. They are planning on heading back to Texas on Thursday morning. I don't know exactly what that means as far as Pam's search, but we will take it a day at a time. It feels good to actually "see" something more being done. Investigator Pitts spent a good portion of the day with us at the bay area. I look out and see Texas Equusearch's big motor coach parked out back, they have a 4-wheeler and mule on their trailer and Tim's big truck...I just can't fathom that they are here to help us find Pam. Talk to you all soon.
