

- **February 1st**

On Friday, Tracy and Leah left for home, taking flyers with them. Reporters from NBC interviewed Don and Paula. Family went separate ways posting flyers outside of Bay County again. More family from Alabama came to help with the search, including Brenda (Pam's sister-in-law), Jared and Justin (Pam's nephews), Adrienne (Justin's wife), and Zachary, Pam's son, finally got to come to Panama City. On their way down, they posted flyers along 231 from Montgomery to Dothan. That evening, Justin, Jared, Don, Jake, Zack, and Adam posted flyers in downtown Panama City, Port Saint Joe, and Mexico Beach.

- **February 2nd**

On Saturday, family went out posting flyers at a mall in Panama City, Captain Anderson piers, and St Andrews park. Randy contacted the Fraternal Order Lodges for support. Cadaver dogs were sent out to search the woods behind the LaQuinta. The dogs found nothing, so for once, no news was good news! The family also decided it would be a good idea to make t-shirts to draw attention to our efforts and Pam's picture. During the evening, family spent time making t-shirts for everyone. They were bright yellow with a picture of the "missing person" flyer on the back and a picture of Pam with the question "Have You Seen Pam?" on the front.

- **February 3rd**

On Sunday, the family decided it was time to go home. Detectives agreed that because so many flyers had been posted in Panama City and the surrounding areas, that they believed if Pam were still there then she would have been reported. Also, because of no findings in the searches with the Coast Guard, Navy, land crew and search dogs, detectives believed that Pam was no longer in Panama City. Family felt that our best efforts could now be served working from home back in the Birmingham, AL area. Before we all left, Don spoke with two more reporters. Coming home without Pam was a hard thing to do.

- **February 4th**

Everyone tried to get a grasp on where to go with the search from home. The biggest goal at the time was getting the local media involved, including the news stations, paper, and radio. Randy contacted the Birmingham News and worked on getting advertisement on Lamar billboards in Birmingham.

- **February 5th**

Bay County posted new flyers considering Pam "endangered". Justin worked on getting Pam's information on the America's Most Wanted website. Contacts with Lamar advertisement were made and Lamar billboards were graciously offered to

display Pam's information in various areas in Alabama. A family meeting was held at 6:30 pm at the O'Charley's in Hoover to collaborate ideas, delegate the work, and hear from a retired Jefferson County Deput on things we could do that we haven't thought of. Tracy, Don's sister, had more t-shirts made with "missing person" information on the front and those were handed out at the meeting also.

- **February 23**

With thoughts that Pam maybe trying to get to Jake in Jacksonville, the family plans to make a trip to Jacksonville, Florida this weekend. They were in Jacksonville, Alabama this past Thursday, looking and hanging flyers. If anyone reads this and wants to help, just leave a message. We'll give you a location to meet us. Any help is welcome!

- **February 28**

Pam's sister Paula and friend Patty, left out this past Sunday morning and traveled to Tallahassee, FL where they checked shelters and passed out flyers. Monday evening they headed out to Jacksonville, FL to join Pam's brother, Randy and his son, Justin, who had arrived in Jacksonville on Sunday night . Together they checked all the shelters they could find and handed out flyers. On Wednesday morning they headed out again in different directions. Paula and Patty to St. Augustine and Randy and Justin to Gainesville. After Patty and Paula finished checking a few shelters in St. Augustine they headed back home to Hueytown. Randy and Justin continued across FL and made their way back to Panama City where they spent last night and all day today.

Don, Pam's husband, went to Jacksonville, NC where he spent the last few days with their son, LCPL Jacob Biggers, before his deployment in mid March.

Together they logged about 4600 miles. That is only a drop of water in the ocean. We just can't cover the territory that needs to be covered alone. Please continue to help us with keeping Pam's picture in the media.
